Washington D.C. --- Fourth District Congressman Nick J. Rahall, today announced that the State of West Virginia is in line for \$7.4 million in federal grant money.

Five projects in the Fourth Congressional District stand to be approved in the coming weeks. They are:

Jenkins-Jones -- \$400,000 for a sewer system

Mercer County -- \$400,000 for a number of projects that will be determined by the County.

Princeton ---- \$400,000 for Housing Rehabilitation and sewers in two neighborhoods.

Mullens ----- \$225,000 for Housing Rehabilitation.

Logan County --- \$400,000 for water projects in the Chapmanville area.

Wyoming County - \$400,000 for several projects, determined by the County.

"These projects, funded by the Department of Housing and Urban Development, will provide Southern West Virginia with much needed federal dollars that in turn will create jobs and economic growth," Congressman Rahall said.

"The planning and development councils of Region 1 and 2, have been very helpful in our obtaining these grants," Rahall went on to say.

"Through the continued efforts of many fine people, I am hopeful we will be able to continue the growth of Southern West Virginia."
