Washington D.C. --- Fourth District Congressman Nick J. Rahall, (D-WV), has announced the schedule of activities for his Southern West Virginia Housing Conference, that will be held at the Mine, Health and Safety Academy in Beckley, Oct. 17-19. Congressman Rahall convened the conference to, "Encourage the development of recommendations to improve housing in southern West Virginia."

The three-day conference will include: Panal discussions on numerous housing problems; Testimony from State, Local and Federal agencies concerned with housing; and seminars dealing with such issues as, FmHA and HUD Rental Programs, State Rules for Housing, Land for Housing, and the Roles of State, Local and Federal Agencies in Assisting.

Congressman Rahall will open the Conference at 9am, followed by a statement from Brooks McCabe, representing Gov. Rockefeller.

Panal discussions will begin at 9:30am, dealing with, "Problems in Delivery of Housing Resources". Panalists will be:

At 3:15pm, testimony will be given by agencies dealing in housing, with specific regards to, What they have done to improve service in the 4th District, and what plans they have for the future. Participants will be:
