Washington D.C. --- Fourth District Congressman Nick J. Rahall, (D-WV), one of 121 bi-partisan Congressional supporters of the Forum On Regulation (FOR), a comprehensive program to improve the Federal regulatory process, announced the release of a "Citizen's Survey" to poll the American public on the impact of Federal regulation.

The announcement came at a morning press conference in the nation's captial.

The "Citizen's Survey", represents the primary imformation gathering instrument of FOR's first phase -- "Nationwide Audit of Federa; Regulation." This survey will be distributed by Members of Congress and sponsoring companies and organizations to collect grass-roots experience on regulation and ideas on what can be done to improve the present system.

The Forum On Regulation is a comprehensive two-year, fourphase effort to assess the nationwide impact of Federal regulation,
and to develope a code of specific principles to improve the overall process. The project is sponsored by a broad range of national
companies and organizations throughout the United States.

Congressman Rahall observed, "The frustrations that the American people experience when they deal with Federal regulations are totally un-called for. Simplification is what we need."
