## RAHALL ANNOUNCES MAJOR COAL MEETING TO BE HELD

WASHINGTON D.C. --- WEST VIRGINIA'S FOURTH DISTRICT CONGRESSMAN NICK J. RAHALL, HAS ANNOUNCED THE SCHEDULING OF A MASS MEETING OF COAL MINERS, COAL OPERATORS, INTERNATIONAL UNION OFFICIALS, AND MEMBERS OF CONGRESS, TO BE HELD IN WASHINGTON D.C. ON NOVEMBER 1.

AS THEY SEEK TO INCREASE THE PRODUCTION OF COAL."

CONGRESSMAN RAHALL STRESSED, "IF THE UNITED STATES IS EVER TO BECOME ENERGY INDEPENDENT, THE ROAD-BLOCKS TO EXPANDED COAL USE AND PRODUCTION MUST BE DONE AWAY WITH, NOW."

"THE AMERICAN PEOPLE ARE PAYING EXORBITANT ENERGY BILLS, AND THEY WANT TO KNOW, WHY NOT COAL?" RAHALL POINTED OUT.

THE MEETING WILL BEGIN AT 10AM, ON THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 1, IN ROOM 345 OF THE CANNON HOUSE OFFICE BUILDING.

PRICE OF IMPORTED OIL, AND WITH TECHNOLOGY NOW AVAILABLE TO BURN

COAL CLEANLY, THERE IS ABSOLUTELY NO REASON WHY WE SHOULD NOT BE

PRODUCING AND USING MORE COAL."
