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WEST VIRGINIA-4th DISTRICT

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WASHINGTON D.C. --- "THE UNKNOWN COST OF GOVERNMENT REGULA-TION AND THE LACK OF A CLEARLY DEFINED ROLE IN ENERGY PRODUCTION IS CAUSING CHAOS IN THE COAL INDUSTRY," WEST VIRGINIA'S FOURTH DISTRICT CONGRESSMAN NICK J. RAHALL, SAID TODAY ON THE FLOOR OF THE U.S. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES.

RAHALL WAS SPEAKING IN REGARDS TO COAL'S ROLE IN THE NATION'S FUTURE ENERGY NEEDS, AND THE PROPOSED REGULATIONS FOR THE SURFACE MINING INDUSTRY.

"RECENTLY, INCREASING COST OF REGULATIONS FOR THE INDUSTRY
IN THE UNITED STATES HAS CAUSED A SLOW DOWN IN PRODUCTION, CREATED A COMPETITIVE DISADVANTAGE WITH FOREIGN ENERGY SOURCES, AND
HAS MEANT THE LOSS OF JOBS FOR HUNDREDS OF WEST VIRGINIA MINERS,"
RAHALL STATED.

"WE NEED TO CREATE AN ATMOSPHERE OF CERTAINTY TO SHOW THAT

THE COMMITMENT TO MAKE COAL A DOMINANT ENERGY SOURCE, IS A GENUINE

AND LONGSTANDING COMMITMENT ON THE PART OF THE FEDERAL GOVERN
MENT," RAHALL POINTED OUT.

CONGRESSMAN RAHALL WENT ON TO SAY, "THE CURRENT UNCERTAIN

ATMOSPHERE SURROUNDING COAL, ADVERSELY AFFECTS EVERY FACET OF COAL

PRODUCTION AND UTILIZATION. IT MAKES IT ALMOST IMPOSSIBLE TO SET

UP LONG-TERM PLANNING THAT IS NEEDED IF THE COAL INDUSTRY IS TO

RESUME A MAJOR ROLE IN OUR NATION'S ENERGY POLICY."

RAHALL MADE REFERENCE TO THE CUTS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY'S COAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT FUNDING AS AN EXAMPLE OF THE GOVERN-MENT'S LACK OF CONCERN. "THE 15 PERCENT REDUCTION SERVES TO DISCURAGE THE KIND OF COMMITMENT THAT IS NECESSARY TO BUILD EXPENSIVE CONVERSION FACILITES TO GASIFY AND LIQUEFY COAL FROM PRIVATE INDUSTRY," RAHALL CHARGED.

"IF THE COAL INDUSTRY IS TO MEET THE DIRECTIVE OF THE PRESIDENT TO DOUBLE PRODUCTION BY 1985, THERE MUST BE SIGNS OF ASSISTANCE ON THE PART OF THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT," CONGRESSMAN RAHALL CONCLUDED.
