NORTHEASTERN GOVERNORS ENDORSE RAHALL COAL BILL

WASHINGTON D.C. --- THE COALITION OF NORTHEASTERN GOVERNORS

HAS APPROVED A RESOLUTION CALLING FOR THE ADOPTION OF A FEDERAL

COAL CONVERSION BILL, BASED ON THE MEASURE INTRODUCED BY WEST

VIRGINIA'S FOURTH DISTRICT CONGRESSMAN NICK J. RAHALL.

CONGRESSMAN RAHALL, CHAIRMAN OF THE CONGRESSIONAL COAL GROUP, WAS INFORMED OF THE RESOLUTION BY MASSACHUSETTS GOVERNOR EDWARD KING, A MEMBER OF THE COALITION.

"I AM ENCOURAGED BY THE ACTION TAKEN BY THE NORTHEASTERN GOVERNORS," RAHALL SAID, " AND I AM PARTICULARLY PLEASED THAT THEY HAVE ENDORSED A COAL CONVERSION PROCESS BASED ON TAX INCENTIVES, SIMILAR TO MY BILL, HR 2325."

"THE SUPPORT OF THESE LEADERS IS IMPERATIVE TO THE PASSAGE

OF A COAL CONVERSION BILL," RAHALL STRESSED, "BECAUSE THEY REPRESENT THE REGION OF THIS COUNTRY THAT WOULD BENEFIT THE MOST FROM

THE CONVERSION OF OIL BURNING ELECTRIC POWER PLANTS TO COAL."

CONGRESSMAN RAHALL OBSERVED, "THE CONVERSION TO COAL OF
TWO MASSACHUSETTS ELECTRIC PLANTS AT BRAYTON POINT AND SALEM HARBOR, IS ALREADY SHOWING PROGRESS IN THE SAVING OF MONEY AND IMPORTED OIL."

"THE BRAYTON POINT FACILITY IS EXPECTED TO SAVE \$169 MILLION

A YEAR BY BURNING COAL, AND THE SALEM HARBOR PLANT IS ESTIMATED

TO SAVE IN EXCESS OF \$54 MILLION A YEAR BY USING COAL," RAHALL

POINTED OUT.

"THERE IS NO DOUBT IN MY MIND, AND IT SEEMS TO BE THE BELIEF

OF THESE GOVERNORS, THAT COAL IS THE ENERGY SOURCE OF FUTURE,"

CONGRESSMAN RAHALL SAID. "WE STILL HAVE A LONG WAY TO GO TO

REACH THE GOAL OF GREATER COAL UTILIZATION, BUT I AM ENCOURAGED

BY THE PROGRESS BEING MADE," RAHALL CONCLUDED.
