RAHALL TO HELP DISABLED RAILROAD, WORKERS

RAHALL SAID.

CONGRESSMAN RAHALL HAS INTRODUCED, HR 3025, WHICH WOULD DOUBLE THE PRESENT OUTSIDE EARNING LIMIT FOR DISABLED RAILROAD WORKERS, TO \$4,800 A YEAR.

RAHALL POINTED OUT, "AT THE PRESENT TIME, OVER 42,000

DISABLED RAILROAD WORKERS ARE RESTRICTED FROM ADDING TO THEIR

INCOME. MY BILL WOULD CHANGE THIS SITUATION."

CONGRESSMAN RAHALL'S BILL HAS THE SUPPORT OF THE UNITED TRANSPORTATION UNION.

"WITH INFLATION STILL AT DOUBLE-DIGIT LEVELS, IT IS IMPORTANT THAT ALL OF US DO WHAT WE CAN TO BRING THE RISING COSTOF-LIVING UNDER CONTROL," RAHALL STRESSED. "YET AT THE SAME
TIME," THE CONGRESSMAN WENT ON TO SAY, "WE MUST ALLOW AMERICANS
LIVING ON FIXED INCOMES THE OPPORTUNITY TO HELP THEMSELVES."
