RAHALL ALSO NOTED THAT, "\$6,072,808, WILL BE ALLOCATED FOR THE PROGRAM TO PROVIDE DISADVANTAGED YOUTH, AGES 16-21, ON A YEAR-ROUND BASIS, WITH INTENSIVE REMEDIAL SKILLS DEVELOPMENT, CAREER COUNSELING, WORK EXPERIENCE, AND OTHER SERVICES TO ENABLE SUCH YOUTH TO OBTAIN JOBS."

A TOTAL OF, \$455,128, FOR THE YOUTH EMPLOYMENT TRAINING PRO-GRAM WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR SPECIAL STATEWIDE YOUTH SERVIES UNDER THE GRANTS TO THE GOVERNORS PROGRAM.
