THIS IS CONGRESSMAN NICK RAHALL.

THE NEW YEAR IS UNDERWAY AND THE 97TH CONGRESS HAS BEGUN. IN TWO WEEKS THE NEW PRESIDENT WILL TAKE THE OATH OF OFFICE, AND THE TRANSITION OF OUR GOVERNMENT WILL BE COMPLETE.

FACING THE NEW CONGRESS AND OUR NEW PRESIDENT WILL BE TWO ISSUES THAT HAVE BEEN WITH US FOR SOMETIME NOW--ENERGY AND INFLATION.

ON THE ENERGY FRONT, COAL CONVERSION LEGISLATION WILL BE A MAJOR PRIORITY. WITH THE CONTINUAL INCREASE IN OPEC OIL, AND WITH THE HEATING SEASON AT ITS PEAK NOW, THE PUSH TOWARDS COAL SHOULD RECEIVE A BIG BOOST.

OUR EFFORTS TO PUT MORE OF AMERICA'S OWN ENERGY RESOURCES TO USE SHOULD LIKWISE SERVE TO CURB INFLATION. THE \$95 BILLION WE SEND OVERSEAS EACH YEAR TO PURCHASE FOREIGN OIL IS A SIGNIFICANT FACTOR OF OUR NATION'S INFLATION RATE, AND ONCE THAT RELIANCE IS REDUCED, MANNEL THE ECONOMY WILL BENEFIT.

I LOOK FORWARD TO THE CHALLENGES THE NEW YEAR WILL BRING, AND I KNOW MANY OF MY COLLEAGUES IN THE HOUSE AND SENATE DO ALSO. AMERICA IS AT AN IMPORTANT CROSSROADS IN TERMS OF ITS FUELRE, AND BY WORKING TOGETHER, WITH THE SUPPORT OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE, 1981 CAN BRING POSITIVE RESULTS FOR THE NATION AND ITS PEOPLE.
