AT THE PRESENT TIME, THERE ARE A NUMBER OF MEASURES CIRCULTING IN THE CONGRESS THAT WOULD REDUCE OR ELIMINATE COST-OF-LIVING ADJUSTMENTS FOR SOCIAL SECURITY RECIPIENTS.

90 PERCENT OF ALL ELDERLY AMERICANS RELY UPON SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS FOR ALL OR PART OF THEIR INCOME, AND THESE COST-OF-LIVING INCREASES ARE OFTEN THE ONLY THING THAT STANDS BETWEEN THEM AND POVERTY.

THE NATIONAL COMMISSION ON SOCIAL SECURITY REFORM IS DUE TO SUBMIT ITS REPORT ON FINANCING THE SYSTEM BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR. WITH THIS IN MIND, I BELIEVE ANY DEBATE ON THE QUESTION OF REDUCING COST-OF-LIVING INCREASES SHOULD BE DELAYED UNTIL THE COMMISSION'S REPORT IS PUBLISHED.
