Eight members of the House Public Works and Transportation Committee will leave Washington on Sunday, Jan. 9 on an 11-day trip with stops in Venezuela, Uruguay, Brazil and the Virgin Islands.

Committee Chairman James J. Howard (D-N.J.), who is leading the delegation, said the Committee has been invited by officials in the host countries to view transportation and public works projects.

The delegation will confer with officials in each of the countries on matters such as bus feeder lines to urban areas, waterborne transportation, economic development programs, highway needs, airport construction and port development.
