## RAHALL PREPARES COAL GROUP FOR NEW CONGRESS

WASHINGTON D.C. --- WEST VIRGINIA'S FOURTH DISTRICT CONGRESSMAN NICK J. RAHALL, FOUNDER AND CHAIRMAN OF THE CONGRESSIONAL
COAL GROUP, HAS BEGUN TO PREPARE THE GROUP'S ACTIVITIES FOR THE
98TH CONGRESS.

IN SOLICITING NEWLY-ELECTED CONGRESSMEN FOR MEMBERSHIP IN THE

COAL GROUP, RAHALL SAID, "THE CONGRESSIONAL COAL GROUP IS A BI-PARTI
SAN ORGANIZATION OF REPRESENTATIVES WHO ARE INTERESTED IN MAKING

COAL A MORE DOMINANT FORCE IN AMERICA'S ENERGY FUTURE."

"THE PRIMARY THRUST OF COAL GROUP ACTIVITIES DEAL WITH THE DISSEMINATION OF INFORMATION ON ISSUES FACING THE CONGRESS WHICH HAVE
AN IMPACT ON COAL," CONGRESSMAN RAHALL OBSERVED. "DURING THE LAST
CONGRESS," RAHALL WENT ON, "THE 66-MEMBER GROUP HELD A NUMBER OF
SEMINARS ON ISSUES SUCH AS: ACID RAIN, COAL EXPORTS AND FOREIGN
TAKE-OVERS OF DOMESTIC ENERGY FIRMS."

"UNEMPLOYMENT IN THE COAL FIELDS WILL NO DOUBT BE THE NUMBER 1 ISSUE IN 1983," RAHALL SAID, "AND AS FAR AS I AM CONCERNED, WE CAN'T GET STARTED SOON ENOUGH ON PUTTING PEOPLE BACK TO WORK, AND TO STABILIZE THE ECONOMY THROUGHOUT THE COALFIELDS OF AMERICA."

BE: THE CLEAN AIR ACT, REHABILITATE THE NATION'S COAL TRANSPORTATION

INFRASTRUCTURE, AND TO CREATE AN OVERALL ENERGY POLICY TO MAKE COAL

COMPETITIVE WITH OTHER COAL EXPORTING NATIONS.
