Washington, D.C. -- Fourth District Representative Nick J. Rahall, II (D-WV) will travel to Cape Canaveral, Florida, aboard a NASA aircraft to view Friday's launching of the space shuttle, Challenger, piloted by Beckley, W. Va., native Jon McBride.

"All West Virginians are extremely proud of Jon McBride", Rahall said, "and I am glad that NASA has placed their trust in one of our own to lead this historic mission". This flight wil carry a crew of seven, including two women and a Canadian astronaut, the largest shuttle crew yet.
