STATES. I FEEL THAT THIS INEQUITY MUST BE ADDRESSED BEFORE THE MARKET FOR

IMPORTED COAL DEPLETES THE NEED FOR OUR OWN COAL HERE AT THOME.

I INTEND TO INTRODUCE LEGISLATION WHICH WILL IMPOSE A TARIFF ON COAL WHICH IS IMPORTED INTO THIS COUNTRY. THE LEVEL OF COAL IMPORTS INTO THE U.S. IN 1983 DOUBLED OVER THE LEVEL OF THE PREVIOUS YEAR AND THIS ALARMING TREND IS CONTINUING IN 1984.

WE CANNOT AFFORD A REPLAY OF WHAT HAS HAPPENED IN THE STEEL INDUSTRY.

WE MUST MAKE A STAND HERE AND NOW FOR DOMESTIC INDUSTRY BEFORE THESE IMPORTS

THROW OUR COAL MINERS OUT OF WORK.
