AN INDIVIDUALS CONDITION AND THAT THE INDIVIDUAL IS NOW ABLE TO ENGAGE IN

SUBSTANTIAL GAINFUL ACTIVITY. THIS DETERMINATION WILL NOW BE MADE BY WEIGHT OF

EVIDENCE ON A NEUTRAL BASIS.

I AM PROUD TO HAVE BEEN A COSPONSOR OF THE HOUSE VERSION OF THIS BILL.

THE DISABILITY PROGRAM IS ALMOST THIRTY YEARS OLD -- AND IT IS STILL A VALID

EXPRESSION OF THIS COUNTRY'S COMPASSION FOR THOSE WHO ARE UNABLE TO TAKE CARE

OF THEMSELVES. PLEASE JOIN ME IN URGING THE PRESIDENT TO SIGN THIS BILL AND

ENACT IT INTO LAW IMMEDIATELY.
