## Rahall Announces Grant to Marshall

Washington, D.C. -- Fourth District Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) today announced that Marshall University has been awarded a grant by the National Council on U.S.-Arab Relations to support two teacher training workshops on "Teaching About the Arab World". The grant of \$4,765, is available upon Marshall's request.

"I am pleased to see this action by the National Council," Rep. Rahall said. "They first made contact with Marshall University when they visited here with the delegation of Saudi Arabian businessmen I brought to Marshall this past spring. They were very impressed by the campus and the staff at the university and thought it would be the ideal place to present these workshops." The grant will be administered through the Political Science Department at Marshall, which has been in contact with the Washington, D.C. based National Council on U.S.-Arab Relations.

"In these tough times of Gramm-Rudman, it is very encouraging to me to see private organizations attempting to fill the void of federal aid left through these budget cuts. I commend the National Council for their action and hope that other organizations will follow their lead," Rep. Rahall observed.
