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## RAHALL SAYS FUNDING BILL PASSED BY HOUSE GOOD FOR WEST VIRGINIA

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- U.S. REP. NICK RAHALL (D-WV) SAYS THAT SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING BILL PASSED BY THE HOUSE TONIGHT CONTAINS PROVISIONS WHICH WILL BE VERY HELPFUL TO PROGRAMS VITAL TO WEST VIRGINIA. THE BILL APPROPRIATES \$1.7 BILLION IN SUPPLEMENTAL FUNDING FOR FISCAL YEAR 1986.

"ONE PROVISION OF THE BILL WHICH I WAS PARTICULARLY HAPPY TO SEE INCLUDED IN THE FINAL VERSION CANCELS SOME \$4.9 BILLION IN SPENDING DEFERRALS WHICH THE ADMINISTRATION HAD PROPOSED," RAHALL OBSERVED. "THE DISAPPROVAL OF DEFERRAL WILL NOW FREE UP \$500 MILLION FOR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANTS, \$700 MILLION FOR THE RURAL HOUSING INSURANCE FUND, \$2.3 BILLION FOR HOUSING ASSISTANCE, \$530.2 MILLION IN HOUSING ASSISTANCE FOR THE ELDERLY AND HANDICAPPED, \$40 MILLION FOR THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ADMINISTRATION, \$22.9 MILLION FOR THE FOSSIL ENERGY RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, \$146 MILLION IN STUDENT FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, NAMELY PELL GRANTS."

THE SUPPLEMENTAL SPENDING BILL ALSO APPROPRIATES \$363 MILLION FOR VETERANS PROGRAMS. "THIS BILL INCLUDES \$272 MILLION FOR VETERANS COMPENSATION AND \$91 MILLION FOR READJUSTMENT BENEFITS. IN ADDITION, THE BILL PROVIDES THROUGH TRANSFERS \$30 MILLION FOR VETERANS MEDICAL CARE, \$35 MILLION FOR VETERANS JOB TRAINING, AND \$6 MILLION FOR GENERAL OPERATING EXPENSES WITHIN THE VETERANS ADMINISTRATION," REP. RAHALL POINTED OUT.

"I WAS ALSO HAPPY TO SEE THAT THE BILL ALSO APPROPRIATED \$20 MILLION FOR THE WOMEN, INFANTS AND CHILDREN (W.I.C.) PROGRAM, AS WELL AS SOME \$8.5 MILLION FOR THE MEALS SERVED UNDER THE OLDER AMERICANS ACT MEALS PROGRAM," RAHALL OBSERVED.

"I AM HAPPY TO SEE THAT THESE PROGRAMS WHICH ARE SO VITAL TO OUR BASIC SURVIVAL IN WEST VIRGINIA WILL BE RECEIVING THE NECESSARY FUNDING TO ALLOW THEM TO CONTINUE TO HELP OUR PEOPLE TO HELP THEMSELVES," RAHALL SAID.

THE SPENDING BILL WILL NOW GO TO THE PRESIDENT FOR HIS APPROVAL.

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
