RAHALL TO DISCUSS McDOWELL ECONOMY

WASHINGTON, D.C. - In an effort to revitalize McDowell County's ailing economy, U.S. Representative Nick Rahall (D-W.Va.) announced today that he will meet with county business and government leaders this weekend in Gary.
