BOARD OF REGENTS RECEIVES GRANT

WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Representative Nick Rahall (D-W.Va.) today announced the awarding of a grant totaling \$82,222 to the West Virginia Board of Regents from the U.S. Department of Education.

The grant was approved for the Congressional Teacher char Scholarship Program. It is designed to enable and encourage outstanding high school graduates to pursue teaching careers at the preschool, elementary or secondary school level.
