RAHALL SEEKS CORPS ACTION ON HUNTINGTON DOCKING PROBLEMS

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- In response to recent complaints about the docking facilities at Harris Riverfront Park in Huntington, U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) has asked the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers to resolve the problems at the Ohio River facility.

The recent excursions to Huntington of the Delta Queen, the Driftwood, and the continuing presence of the West Virginia Belle have been hampered by river sediment in the vicinty of the park. "The area apparently needs to be dredged before we are unable to accommodate these vessels any longer," Rahall said. "I have asked the Army Corps of Engineers to look into the problem and see what can be done to facilitate any action in that area before it is too late."

Rahall is awaiting the results of a Corps investigation he asked for earlier this month.

"The Ohio River and its water traffic have played an increasingly important role in the economic rejuvenation of the Tri-State area," Rahall observed. "We need to make evert effort to allow the river to continue to fill this role."
