WEST VIRGINIA TO RECEIVE SECOND U.S. JUSTICE
DEPARTMENT GRANT

WASHINGTON D.C. - U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-W.Va.) today announced the U.S. Department of Justice has awarded \$1,205,000 to assist West Virginia and local governments within the State to control crime and enforce anti-drug abuse statutes.

"This grant will aid West Virginia in developing a statewide strategy for drug and violent crime control programs that improve the criminal justice system, paying particular attention to drug trafficking, violent crime, and serious offenders." Rahall said.

The Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA), a U.S. Department of Justice Agency within the Office of Justice Programs, today awarded the West Virginia Criminal Justice and Highway Safety Office \$1,205,000 to help the commonwealth and its units of local government control crime and enforce anti-drug abuse statutes.

BJA Director Charles P. Smith said the funds are awarded under the state and local narcotics control provisions of the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988. The funds are distributed among the states on the basis of their relative populations, after each state has been allocated a base amount of \$500,000. The states must redistribute a portion of their funds to local units of government.

To participate in the block grant program, a state office designated by the governor submits an application to the Bureau. The application must include a statewide strategy for drug and violent crime control programs that improve the functioning of the criminal justice system, with an emphasis on drug trafficking, violent crime, and serious offenders. The state agency must also provide assurances about its stewardship of the Federal funds and its intention to comply with the Act's provisions, including a certification that state recipients have fulfilled the drug-free workplace requirements.
