RAHALL TAPS INTERIOR DEPARTMENT FOR STATE RECREATION FUNDS

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- U.S. REP. NICK J. RAHALL, II (D-WV) ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR WILL PARCEL OUT \$16.5 MILLION IN GRANTS FROM THE LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND TO ASSIST THE STATES IN "STATE OUTDOOR" PROJECTS FOR FISCAL YEAR 1990. WEST VIRGINIA WILL RECEIVE \$191,925 OF THESE FUNDS FOR USE IN VARIOUS STATE PROJECTS.

"THESE GRANTS HAVE BEEN EXCEPTIONALLY USEFUL IN THE PAST FOR FUNDING OF SUCH THINGS AS PUBLIC SWIMMING POOLS AND RECREATION AREAS IN THE FOURTH DISTRICT," SAID RAHALL.

THE LAND AND WATER CONSERVATION FUND, ADMINISTERED BY THE NATIONAL PARK SERVICE, PROVIDES MATCHING GRANTS ON A 50/50 basis to State and local units of government for the ACQUISITION AND DEVELOPMENT OF PUBLIC OUTDOOR RECREATION AREAS AND FACILITIES.

"THIS MONEY WILL HELP STIMULATE, THROUGH ITS PLANNING AND MATCHING REQUIREMENTS, GREATER NON-FEDERAL AND PRIVATE INVESTMENT IN THE DEVELOPMENT AND UPKEEP OF OUTDOOR RECREATION FACILITIES," SAID RAHALL.

INTERIOR DISTRIBUTES \$16.5 MILLION FOR STATE OUTDOOR ASSISTANCE

Secretary of the Interior Manuel Lujan today announced the apportionment of \$16.5 million from the Land and Water Conservation Fund for assistance to the 50 States, Puerto Rico, Virgin Islands, Guam, American Samoa, the Northern Mariana Islands, and the District of Columbia, for Fiscal Year 1990.

"These funds will assist State and local units of government in the planning and development of outdoor recreation facilities which will benefit present and future generations, and provide greater recreation opportunities in and near urban areas," Lujan said. "The money will help stimulate, through its planning and matching requirements, greater non-Federal and private investment in the provisions and maintenance of outdoor recreation facilities," he said.

The Land and Water Conservation Fund, administered by the National Park Service, provides matching grants on a 50/50 basis to State and local units of government for the acquisition and development of public outdoor recreation areas and facilities.

The major share of the Fund is derived from revenues produced by Outer Continental Shelf oil and gas leasing.
