WEST VIRGINIA EDUCATION TO RECEIVE 36,000 FEDERAL DOLLARS

WASHINGTON, DC -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today that the U.S. Department of Education awarded 2 grants, totaling \$36,287, to the West Virginia Department of Education.

For the Christa McAuliffe Fellowship Program, which awards fellowships to experienced teachers, West Virginia received \$26,746. Uses of fellowships include sabbaticals, consultation with or assistance to other school districts, development of special innovative programs, projects or partnerships that involve the business community and the schools, programs that incorporate the use and the sharing of technologies to help students learn, or expanding or replicating model programs of staff development.

A \$6,541 reallocation grant was received for innovative foreign language instruction programs. This grant is in addition to the \$70,584 originally awarded to West Virginia schools.

"I think West Virginia's elementary and secondary education will benefit greatly from the creative approaches that this grant supports," said Rahall.


Several months ago, Fiscal Year 1992 appropriations of \$10,000,000 were allotted to State educational agencies (SEAs) under Title II, Part B, the Foreign Languages Assistance Program of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended, to fund model programs in their local educational agencies (LEAs).

Funds were allotted to States based on a formula that considers school-age population (ages 5-17). Because several States have chosen not to submit applications, those funds are now being reallocated to participating States. Each SEA distributes funds on a competitive grant basis to LEAs for model programs that represent innovative approaches to foreign language instruction. This formula grant program is intended to improve the quantity and quality of instruction at both the elementary and secondary school levels.

The attached list contains the original amount and the additional amount to be received by each State that has submitted an application which has been approved by the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education. The appropriate grant award documents will be forwarded to your State within the next few days.

We are pleased to inform you that under the Higher Education Amendments of 1992, Subpart 2, the Christa McAuliffe Fellowship Program, \$1,964,160 is being allotted to State educational agencies (SEAs) to enable them to conduct Christa McAuliffe activities and award fellowships to experienced teachers.

Section 532(b) of Public Law 102-325 permits the Secretary to adjust the awards to ensure that each State receives a fellowship award of sufficient size to carry out the purposes of the program. Funds are allotted to a State based on a formula that considers its school-aged population (age 5-17) with the added provision that no State receives less than 103 percent of its 1990-91 average teacher salary.

Fellowships are awarded to experienced teachers who have submitted an application to his/her State. Uses of fellowships include sabbaticals, consultation with or assistance to other school districts, development of special innovative programs, projects or partnerships that involve the business community and the schools, programs that incorporate the use and the sharing of technologies to help students learn, or expanding or replicating model programs of staff development.

The attached list contains the amount to be received by each State that has submitted an application which has been approved by the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education. The appropriate grant award documents will be forwarded to your State within the next few days.
