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**\$11 MILLION FOR WV UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ADMINISTRATION**

WASHINGTON, DC -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today that the U.S. Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration approved a FY 1994 \$11,196,527 allocation for administration of West Virginia's Unemployment Insurance Program.

"If West Virginia's workload exceeds the currently forecasted level, upon which this allocation is based," said Rahall, "additional funds will automatically be made available." Congress has appropriated \$347.3 million in contingency funds for this purpose.

The United States Department of Labor's Employment and Training Administration (ETA) has approved final State allocations of funds from the State Unemployment Insurance and Employment Service Operations appropriation for State administration of the Unemployment Insurance (UI) Program. These allocations are based on the final FY 1994 Labor/HHS Appropriations Act, recently enacted by Congress, and are updates to the planning targets that were provided to the States in May. *KSP*

Because Congress did not change the base dollar amount in the President's request, the final allocations are essentially the same as the planning targets issued to the States in May. The final allocations provide \$1,961 million, an increase of \$121 million from the FY 1993 base level.

In addition to these base allocations, Congress appropriated \$347.3 million in the contingency category for anticipated workload above what can be financed by the base grants. If the workload exceeds the currently forecasted level, the contingency reserve language in the appropriation ensures that additional funds will be automatically made available (through the OMB apportionment process) to cover the resulting costs. Therefore, all UI workload will be funded in FY 1994.

The attached State-by-State final base allocations are being made available to the State employment security agencies through the ETA regional system.
