RAHALL ANNOUNCES EMERGENCY SHELTER FUNDING

WASHINGTON, DC -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development awarded the following Emergency Shelter Grants: \$708,000 to the State of West Virginia and \$79,000 to the City of Huntington.

"The Emergency Shelter Grants Program is designed to give states and communities great flexibility in meeting their needs," said Rahall. "Funding may be used to improve emergency shelters for the homeless, increase available shelter space, help pay the shelters' operating expenses, provide essential social services to the homeless, or to help prevent homelessness. Huntington and the State may allocate their awards among these objectives in whatever way best meets local needs."

EMERGENCY SHELTER GRANTS (ESG) PROGRAM

This message concerns the forthcoming allocation of the ESG Program funds to grantees across the nation. As a result of the enactment of HUD FY 1994 appropriation (Public Law 103-124, October 28, 1992) \$115,000,000 is available for the Emergency Shelter Grants (ESG) Program, as authorized by the Subtitle B of Title IV of the Stewart B. McKinney Homeless Assistance Act, as amended. A total of \$209,000 of unused funds has been added to the formula allocation.

This flexible program allocates funds by formula each year to certain Entitlement City or County, and State governments to plan for and meet their own needs to assist homeless individuals and families. This program makes possible the first steps in a "continuum of care" designed to assist homeless persons find permanent housing solutions and regain independent living.

Outreach/assessment activities, drop-in centers, and essential life-saving services may be funded through this program. Communities may use funds also to prevent homelessness through short-term rental assistance, legal assistance, and other services related to individuals and families remaining in their own housing. The program facilitates creation, improvement, and operation of emergency shelters and transitional housing as well as to provide services such as case management, substance abuse treatment, and job training.

A list containing the official allocation for each grantee is attached. The allocation includes a statutorily-mandated set-aside of one percent of the total ESG Program appropriation, or \$1,150,000, for allocation to Indian tribes. This leaves \$114,059,000 to be allocated by formula. The additions to the list of formula grantees are Bakersfield, CA, Salinas, CA, Tallahassee, FL, Houma, LA, Pontiac, MI, St. Louis County, MN, Amarillo, TX, and Arlington, TX.

Allocations are based on the formula used in the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program during the 1993 fiscal year. The purpose of the ESG Program is to help improve the quality of emergency shelters for the homeless, make available additional shelters, meet the costs of operating shelters, provide essential social services to the homeless, and to help prevent homelessness.
