
President Clinton's State of the Union Address

MIDDLE CLASS BILL OF RIGHTS

To help hard-working American families: Raise and educate their children. Train for higher-paying jobs. Buy a first home. Save for retirement.

Child Tax Credit -- Up to \$500 for each child 12 years old and under, for families earning less than \$75,000.

Education Tax Deduction -- Up to \$10,000 deduction per family for tuition for college, community college, vocational colleges, graduate school, and worker retraining for families making less than \$120,000.

Expanded IRA -- Up to \$2,000 in tax-free contributions to an IRA account, or tax-free withdrawals, for families with incomes up to \$100,000. Penalty-free withdrawals for education, major medical expenses and the purchase of a first home.

Skill Grants. Up to \$3000 in grants as well as loans to empower dislocated and low-income workers to get new skills. Paid for by consolidating more than 50 training programs.

Investments in Education and Training. Long-term investments in education and job training to give Americans the skills they need to compete in the global economy.

Paid For By Cuts in Government Spending. The plan will be paid for by maintaining the freeze on discretionary spending (\$52 billion in savings) and by major cuts in Cabinet Departments and agencies. (\$24 billion).

STATE OF THE UNION

THE PRESIDENT IS FIGHTING FOR:

A NEW ECONOMY -- preparing our people for the demands of the New American economy; working to raise incomes. A Middle Class Bill of Rights to help middle class families raise and educate their children, train for higher-paying jobs, buy a first home, and save for retirement. Vigilance on the deficit. Reducing barriers to American exports. Enacting health care reform.

A NEW GOVERNMENT -- creating a smaller, more effective government to meet new challenges, not serve old interests. Smallest federal work-force since Kennedy. Cutting unnecessary spending and programs. Real lobbying and campaign finance reform.

A NEW COVENANT of rights and responsibilities between government and the American people.

Helping people obtain the tools they need to improve their lives; asking them to take responsibility for themselves and their communities.

Reforming our welfare system to demand responsibility and move people to work. Continuing the fight against crime. Building on the national service program.

WORKING WITH CONGRESS where

possible, but not allowing Congress to take us backwards. No roll-back of progress we've made cutting the deficit, reforming education, fighting crime, or improving public health and the environment.

TALKING POINTS ON STATE OF THE UNION ADDRESS JANUARY 24, 1995

- The President is going to speak about where he wants to take the country and how he intends to work with the new Congress in accomplishing his goals for the nation.
- This is a time of both challenge and opportunity for the American people.
 - Despite the economic recovery, too many families are still working harder for less and are concerned about their future. Those with inadequate education and training are facing stagnant or falling incomes. Our values as a people are under attack.
 - There is great opportunity in the changing economy. Half of today's jobs did not exist just 20 years ago. Markets abroad are being opened; peace and democracy are spreading.
- The President will talk about his economic strategy for preparing the American people to face the demands of today's economy and to raise incomes today and in the future. This includes continued vigilance on the deficit, the Middle Class Bill of Rights -- which will help middle class families meet the costs of raising and educating their children, obtaining training for higher-paying jobs, purchasing a first home, and saving for their retirement -- continuing to reduce barriers to our exports, and enacting health care reform.
- The President will also reiterate his commitment to reforming government and the political system -- creating a government that is smaller and more effective, that meets new challenges instead of serving old interests. This means continuing the reinvention of government, cutting the Federal bureaucracy by 272,000 positions, cutting unnecessary spending and programs, and providing for needed political reforms, including lobbying and campaign finance reform.
- Finally, the President will reassert the New Covenant of rights and responsibilities between government and the American people. Government must help people obtain the necessary tools to improve their lives, but people must take the responsibility of building their lives, their communities, and their country. This means reforming our welfare system to a system of work and responsibility; it also means continuing the fight against crime; and it means building on the Americorps national service program.
- In fighting for these principles, the President will work with the Congress whenever possible -- whenever they want to move forward with him. However, he will not permit the Congress to take us backward -- to go back on the progress made over the past two years in combating the deficit, in reforming education, in fighting crime.
