### RAHALL SPELLS RELIEF FOR SMALL WV COAL OPERATORS

WASHINGTON, DC -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today that the U.S. Department of the Interior awarded \$140,000 to West Virginia for the Small Coal Operator's Assistance Program (SOAP).

"This \$140,000 for SOAP will help West Virginia's smaller coal mining operations with the expense of preforming the research required for mining permit applications," said Rahall. "Without assistance from SOAP the cost of obtaining the necessary data can prove too much for smaller businesses."

In 1990, concerned that most small coal operations weren't being reached by SOAP, Rahall, then-Chairman of the House Mining Subcommittee, raised SOAP's annual production limit from 100,000 to 300,000 tons, allowing more operators to qualify for assistance. "With the 100,000 ton limit SOAP wasn't reaching the mining operations it was intended to help, said Rahall. "With that change in law now in effect, this grant for the SOAP program will bring relief to small West Virginia coal operators."
