15. SUMMARY DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT (See instruction on reverse)

This award is part of the Bureau of Justice Statistics (BJS) State statistical analysis national network program. The goals of this program are to: (1) encourage States to develop a structure that promotes the collection of common justice system statistical data among the states; (2) develop a mechanism to share data and information among the States and with BJS; (3) permit access to Federal and states data by the SAC; and (4) enhance the capabilities of the States in developing and analyzing policy-relevant information. During the 12-month period, the West Virginia SAC will: edit and publish the West Virginia Criminal Justice Journal; provide statistical assistance training at the State Police Academy and other local agency sites; maintain the SAC clearinghouse for criminal justice agencies within the State; participate on the State's Criminal History Records Improvement Task Force; and undertake research related to domestic violence and law enforcement promotional testing. Moreover, the SAC will continue to serve as the single point of contact for statistical data requested by BJS, other Federal agencies, and private organizations such as SEARCH Group and JRSA.
