PUBLIC RADIO COMES IN LOUD AND CLEAR

WASHINGTON, D.C.-- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-W.Va.) announced today that the National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) awarded the West Virginia Broadcasting Authority \$184,930 to improve the system's radio signals.

The funding, which is about half of the \$369,860 needed for the project, will be used to build eight downlink sites throughout the State. The new downlinks will provide higher quality reception for the 1,956,264 people the system presently serves.

"The new downlinks will provide West Virginians a more reliable information source," said Rahall. "The new system relies on a satellite transmission, not on the present microwave system."
