### NOTIFICATION TO MEMBERS OF CONGRESS AWARD OF FY 1994 GRANTS TO PARTICIPATING STATE AGENCIES PAUL DOUGLAS TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

August 1994

Grants to State agencies for the States listed on the attached table have been approved for the Paul Douglas Teacher Scholarship Program's ninth year of operation (for scholarships for academic year 1994-95). The program is authorized under Title V, Part C, Subpart 1 of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (HEA), as amended, Pub. L. 102-325.

Grants for fiscal year 1994 are now being made to 47 States, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, American Samoa, Northern Mariana Islands, Palau, and the Virgin Islands. The awards for all States total \$14,681,000.

State allotments are based on a formula comparing the ratio of each State's school-aged population (ages 5-17) to the total school-aged population in all participating States. (Certain States chose to fund only renewal scholars.) Participating States use the funds to provide scholarships for study at institutions of higher education to outstanding high school graduates or recent GED recipients who show promise in teaching. The scholarships are given for up to \$5,000 per year for up to 4 years of study.

To receive program allotments, a State must enter into an agreement with the Secretary of Education under which the State agency agrees to administer the program in compliance with the regulations in 34 CFR Part 653 and applicable parts of the Education Department General Administrative Regulations.

The format used in this allotment table includes: (1) the amount of funds allotted to each State in fiscal year 1994 and (2) the estimated number of scholarships allotted to each State.
