CONGRESSIONAL NOTIFICATION OF FY 1994 GRANT AWARDS FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO STATES AND OUTLYING AREAS FOR CHAPTER 2 - FEDERAL, STATE, AND LOCAL PARTNERSHIP FOR EDUCATIONAL IMPROVEMENT

We are pleased to inform you that, under Chapter 2 of Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended, \$369,500,000.00 is being allotted to State educational agencies (SEAs) to fund activities at the State and local educational agency (LEA) levels.

Funds are allotted to the States on the basis of school-age population. The SEA then distributes not less than 80 percent of the funds received to the LEAs within the State. The Department of Education makes funds available on the basis of an approved State application. LEAs apply to the SEA to receive a subgrant. The amount of the subgrants to LEAs is based on the relative enrollments in public schools and in private nonprofit schools that desire their students to participate in the Chapter 2 programs.

The attached list contains the amount to be received by each State that has submitted an application approved by the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education. The applicable grant documents will be forwarded to your State within the next few days.
