W.V. MATH, SCIENCE, AND FOREIGN LANGUAGE PROGRAMS RECEIVE FUNDING

WASHINGTON D.C. -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today that funds released by the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education in the Department of Education will be designated for two areas in the West Virginia educational system.

A Dwight D. Eisenhower Mathematics and Science Education grant in the amount of \$1,992,461 will fund the training of teachers in the math and science fields for grades kindergarten through twelve.

The Foreign Languages Assistance Program grant will provide for the improvement of the quality and quantity of foreign language taught in West Virginia schools on both the elementary and secondary levels. The grant is in the amount of \$82,291.

"The quality of education the children of West Virginia receive depends greatly upon the instruction they receive in the classroom," Rahall stated. "The grant funding will provide additional necessary resources and training for our school teachers in West Virginia; therefore, the classroom environment will be greatly improved for both students and teachers," Rahall concluded.

WASHINGTON D.C. -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today that funds released by the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education in the Department of Education will be designated for two areas in the West Virginia educational system.

We are pleased to inform you that under Title II, Part B, the Foreign Languages Assistance Program of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended, a total of \$10,802,880 from Fiscal Year 1994 appropriations is being allotted to State educational agencies (SEAs) to fund model programs in their local educational agencies (LEAs).

Funds are allotted to a State based on a formula that considers its school-age population (ages 5-17). Each SEA distributes funds on a competitive grant basis to LEAs for model programs that represent innovative approaches to foreign language instruction. This formula grant program is intended to improve the quantity and quality of instruction at both the elementary and secondary school levels.

The attached list contains the amount to be received by each State that has submitted an application which has been approved by the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education. The appropriate grant award documents will be forwarded to your State within the next few days.

Funds are allotted to a State based on a formula that considers its school-aged population (ages 5-17) and the number of children identified as economically disadvantaged.
- * Funding from The Foreign Languages Assistance Program is allotted to a State based on a formula, and is intended to improve the quality and quantity of foreign language instruction at both the elementary and secondary school levels.

We are pleased to inform you that under the Dwight D. Eisenhower Mathematics and Science Education Program of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965, as amended, \$248,327,300 is being allotted to State educational agencies (SEAs) and State agencies for higher education (SAHEs) to fund activities at the State and local educational agency (LEA) levels and at institutions of higher education (IHEs).

Funds are allotted to a State based on a formula that considers its school-aged population (age 5-17) and the number of children identified as economically disadvantaged. Of the funds a State receives, 75 percent is administered by the SEA and 25 percent is administered by the SAHE. Funds are committed primarily to programs which benefit teachers and students in grades K-12 and are used for teacher training, retraining and pre-service training to improve instruction in mathematics and science.

The attached list contains the amount to be received by each State that has submitted an application which has been approved by the Office of Elementary and Secondary Education. The appropriate grant award documents will be forwarded to your State within the next few days.
