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HOME GRANT AWARDED TO CABELL-HUNTINGTON-WAYNE HOUSING CONSORTIUM

WASHINGTON D.C. -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today that the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development has awarded a Home Investment Partnership Program formula grant to Cabell-Huntington-Wayne Housing Consortium. Funding for the project is in the amount of \$912,000.

The purpose of the grant funding is to encourage an increase in the construction of affordable housing for low income persons. The release of funding aims to construct strong partnerships between all levels of government in West Virginia and the private sector. The emergence of such partnerships will bring a higher quality and quantity of affordable housing for West Virginia residents.

"The Home Investment Partnership Program grants will build stronger ties between the West Virginia government and our private sector, including non-profit organizations," Rahall stated. "A joint effort by both the public and private sectors will only enhance the standards of living for residents throughout our communities," concluded Rahall.
