\$29 MILLION IN HISTORIC PRESERVATION

GRANT FUNDS APPORTIONED

Secretary of the Interior Manuel Lujan today announced the apportionment of \$29.65 million for historic preservation grants to the 50 States, the District of Columbia, the U.S. Territories, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Republic of the Marshall Islands, the Republic of Palau, and the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

The awards, which include \$4,507,000 to the National Trust and \$25,145,000 to the other recipients, were appropriated for Historic Preservation Fund grants under Public Law 101-121 for the period through September 30, 1990. The amounts allocated were reduced as mandated by the revised Gramm-Rudman-Hollings Act (Public Law 100-119).

"The funds made available will be used to strengthen the capability of the recipients to identify, evaluate, and protect their historic and archeological resources," Lujan said.

Grants-in-aid may be used for a broad range of activities such as historic property inventories, resource protection planning, nominations to the National Register of Historic Places, project inspections, monitoring for compliance with Federal preservation requirements, technical assistance to private interests that seek to preserve and protect historic resources through preservation tax incentives, assisting local government preservation programs, and acquisition or development of historic properties.

The National Park Service administers the Historic Preservation Fund. Amounts made available to each of the jurisdictions, and to the National Trust for Historic Preservation, are listed on the reverse side of this page.
