RAHALL ANNOUNCES GRANTS FOR THE ARTS AND EPA

WASHINGTON, D.C.-- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today two grants for the Fourth District. The National Endowment for The Arts and the Environmental Protection Agency have both alerted Rahall to funds flowing into West Virginia.

The National Endowment for The Arts has awarded the Huntington Museum of Art \$5,000 to "support the improvement of storage for the museum's glass and print collections."

Also Rahall trumpeted that the Environmental Protection Agency has awarded \$165,060 to the Pee Ridge Public Service District in Barboursville, West Virginia. That amount added to the \$1.06 million that has already been granted brings that projects total to \$1.23 million. The EPA announced that the funds will be used for "expansion and upgrading of the A & B plants, construction of B plant effluent line, construction of pumping station and force main, and flood proofing of existing pump stations."

"These two grants do not exactly compliment each other," joked Rahall. "But it's good to see money coming into the Fourth District from all angles."
