

RAHALL ANNOUNCES "TAKE PRIDE IN AMERICA WINNERS"

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) announced today the Department of Interior's "Take Pride in America" winners for 1989.

"Take Pride in America" is a national campaign to increase awareness of the need for wise use of the nation's natural and cultural resources, encourage an attitude of stewardship and responsibility toward public resources, and promote volunteerism.

Supported by a dedicated partnership of 12 federal agencies, 48 states and many private sector organizations, the campaign annually sponsors a national awards ceremony to recognize those who have made outstanding contributions to protecting and enhancing public resources.

The 1989 nominations were judged based on the need for the activity; the effect of the activity on public awareness; the effectiveness of the methods used; the effect on public lands; and the amount and variety of participation in the activity.

From West Virginia, there were two winners. The Pride Against Litter campaign in Elkins, West Virginia and from the Fourth District, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers was awarded the honor for their work at the R.D. Bailey Lake in Justice, West Virginia.

"These two West Virginia groups have led a campaign of environmental awareness through example, and they should be commended," said Rahall. "They show to us that to accept any environment other than a clean environment is completely unacceptable."

TAKE PRIDE IN AMERICA ANNOUNCES 1989 NATIONAL AWARD WINNERS

Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan announced today that a Blue Ribbon Panel of Judges, chaired by First Lady Barbara Bush, has selected 89 top winners of the fourth annual Take Pride in America National Awards Program.

"These individuals and organizations have made the choice to become involved, to care and to volunteer. They exhibit the shining qualities of get-up-and-go and responsibility for the common good that have made America great," said Lujan.

The Blue Ribbon Panel of Judges selected the 89 most outstanding stewardship activities from among 175 finalists. Nearly 700 groups and individuals were nominated for consideration in the 1989 National Awards Program. The winners represent 29 states. Most nominations came from the 48 states formally participating in the program, many of which sponsored state-wide awards competitions.

"Public education occurs through the recognition of these winners," said Lujan. "We believe this motivates others to become active and involved in furthering the goals of the Take Pride in America campaign, and encourages the American spirit of volunteerism, citizenship and pride."

Take Pride in America is a national campaign to increase awareness of the need for wise use of the nation's natural and cultural resources, encourage an attitude of stewardship and responsibility toward public resources, and promote volunteerism.

A major component of the initiative is a public service awareness campaign using radio, TV and print media. In the first public service ads, celebrity spokesmen Clint Eastwood, Charles Bronson and Louis Gossett, Jr., serve as "tough, good guys" with the message, "Bad guys abuse public land; good guys save it." A second phase of advertising was released in 1989 featuring "spokesalien" ALF, who appealed to a younger audience, saying, "Look, folks, public lands are not like pizzas — you just can't pick up the phone and order more." The campaign is currently filming a new public service ad featuring actress Linda Evans, who will give the message that there is something that everyone can do to Take Pride in America and help to protect our environment.
