This winter over 2,500 outstanding high school juniors and seniors from across the country will come to Washington, D.C. as participants in the 1991 National Young Leaders Conference sponsored by the Congressional Youth Leadership Council.

The theme of the National Young Leaders Conference is "The Leaders of Tomorrow Meeting the Leaders of Today." Throughout, their week in Washington, scholars will meet with key leaders and newsmakers from the three branches of government, the media and diplomatic community. The seven session dates of the conference are:

January 15 to January 20	February 5 to February 10	February 26 to March 3

During these sessions, students will be on Capitol Hill each Thursday to learn about the legislative process firsthand. From the hours of 11:45 a.m. to 2:45 p.m. students have scheduled meetings with their representative and senators or designated congressional staff. (The appointment scheduler in your office has received a similar packet of information requesting to schedule student appointments.)

It is the Council's goal to provide as much media exposure for these outstanding young leaders as possible. Currently, we send press releases to the local media in each student's hometown. In an attempt to expand this coverage, I have enclosed the following information: 1) a sample press release; 2) press clippings of students with their Members; 3) a previous conference schedule; 4) a listing of the Member's constituents indicating the Thursday they will be on Capitol Hill. In the past, congressional offices have elected to interview students for their own newsletter, submit articles and photos to district newspapers, and schedule radio and television interviews for the Member with students in the press galleries.

I hope this information is of interest to you. Please feel free contact me for additional information or to schedule any special press coverage with these young leaders, as I would be more than happy to work with you.

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Beginning January 15 through March 10, 1991, over 2,500 outstanding high school juniors and seniors from across the country will attend one of seven week-long sessions of the 1991 National Young Leaders Conference sponsored by the Congressional Youth Leadership Council in the nation's capital.

The theme of the National Young Leaders Conference is *The Leaders of Tomorrow Meeting the Leaders of Today.* Throughout the conference, scholars will meet with key leaders and newsmakers from the three branches of government, the media and the diplomatic corps. Students attending the conference have been selected by the Council or their high school principals based on demonstrated academic achievement, leadership and citizenship.

Highlights of the program will include welcoming remarks from a Member of Congress on the Floor of the United States House of Representatives, a government relations forum comprised of lobbyists from corporations and public interest groups, and a panel discussion led by prominent journalists at the National Press Club. Diplomatic embassy visits and a briefing at the State Department will also be among each week's activities.

The students will also have the unique opportunity to meet with their senators and representative or designated congressional staff members. These meetings enable scholars to discuss important policy issues and focus on topics of national, state and local concern. Culminating the National Young Leaders Conference will be *The Mock Congress* during which scholars assume the roles of United States Representatives by debating, lobbying and voting on proposed volunteer service legislation.

The National Young Leaders Conference is sponsored by the Congressional Youth Leadership Council. Founded in 1985, the Council is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, educational organization committed to recognizing outstanding youth and providing them with a "hands-on" civic learning experience in the nation's capital. "We firmly believe that by touching one life, the National Young Leaders Conference enriches thousands more," said John Hines, Council Executive Director. "Scholars return to their schools and communities charged with the lifelong duty of leading all Americans to better understand their rights and responsibilities in this participatory democracy."


