RAHALL SAYS SOIL CONSERVATION SERVICE WILL STUDY FOURPOLE

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV) today voiced his pleasure at the recent request to the U.S. Soil Conservation Service from the Appropriations Committee to "review and provide a report on the problem related to the landslide along Fourpole Creek near Huntington, West Virginia."

"Fourpole has a manageable problem," said Rahall. "We just need to get the ball rolling and see how best we can fix it. The families along Fourpole's banks deserve the peace of mind that their property is safe."

The study will be conducted by the Soil Conservation Service and will be submitted to the House Agriculture Committee for review.

"This is the first step. We have seen so often how the waters of Fourpole have affected the lives of those families bordering it, and we think how easy it would be to help them if people could just see the effects. This report will be the eyes of the Committee, it will help them to see our plight," said Rahall.
