## RAHALL'S BATTLE CRY: BE AMERICAN, BUY AMERICAN

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV), fed up with ever increasing trade deficits with Japan and Germany, has introduced legislation to designate Labor Day week (Sept. 2-8) as "Buy America Week." Already, 84 of Rahall's colleagues have joined him by cosponsoring this measure.

"The American people are fed up with the United States trade policy," said Rahall. "American workers are tired of seeing their hard work being passed over for cheaper goods produced by slave labor in countries like Mexico."

"This legislation is a wake-up call to the Administration and the American people. We still produce the best goods in the world, and we need to protect our interests both here and abroad. So if you want to be American, buy American."

Rahall quoted trade statistics that placed the United States with the number one ranking worldwide in trade deficits (\$110 billion). Germany and Japan both had trade surpluses, \$44 billion and \$32 billion respectively.

"The Japanese want to sell us everything from toasters to televisions to cars; yet we cannot even export rice to their country," said Rahall.

Rahall warned the U.S. cannot travel down the road their on much longer. "We have a mountain of foreign debt totaling \$660 billion. Germany and Japan are on the plus side."

Rahall urged everyone to support his efforts to have "Buy America Week." The money we put back into our economy is not only good for workers, its good for business and industry as well. He stressed that buying American provides jobs for American workers, boosts American businesses and strengthens the United States economy.

"We need to remind ourselves that we have the brightest, strongest, most motivated work force in the world, and they should not be taken for granted," said Rahall. "Buy America Week reminds of that fact."
