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MARSHALL TO SET-UP JOINT LABOR-MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Marshall University has been awarded \$78,259 by the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service to set-up a joint labor-management committee, designed to improve labor relations and increase productivity, according to U.S. Rep. Nick Rahall (D-WV).

Marshall was one of only 13 to be selected for the grant, which was established as part of the 1978 Labor-Management Cooperation Act.

There were over 101 applications.

"This program will be a major economic development tool for the entire Huntington area," said Rahall. "Business and community leaders have been chosen, in a spirit of cooperation, to make sound decisions on the economic future of the entire region."
