WEST VIRGINIA GROUPS WIN NATIONAL TAKE PRIDE IN AMERICA AWARD

WASHINGTON, D.C. -- The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' Beech Fork Lake Project and the Division of Natural Resources' Youth Conservation Program are among the national winners in the annual Take Pride in America awards program, U.S. Rep. Nick J. Rahall (D-WV) announced today.

"While most folks know the Army Corps as a builder of locks and dams, this award illustrates another more benign side of the agency," Rahall said. "It is great that the outstanding work of the West Virginia Youth Conservation Program has gained national recognition," he added.

The Take Pride in America National Awards Program recognizes individuals and public and private organizations which have contributed to the wise use of America's resources. The winners are selected by a panel of judges headed by Interior Secretary Manuel Lujan. This year there are 100 winners nationwide, three of which are from West Virginia.

In addition to the Corps of Engineers and the West Virginia Youth Conservation Program, also receiving an award is Pride Against Litter in Elkins.

The Beech Fork Lake Project is being recognized for its volunteer program that resulted in the collection of five tons of garbage from the lake. The DNR's Youth Conservation Program received an award due to its statewide environmental education and litter control programs. Pride Against Litter in Elkins is being honored for its litter control efforts in Randolph County.

"I want to commend the Beech Fork project manager, Ronald Hooper, and the Huntington District for receiving this award. This award is also a tribute to the youth groups in West Virginia who participate in the conservation program and to DNR Director Ed Hamrick as well," Rahall said.

The award winners will be invited to Washington, D.C., for a July 21st ceremony at Constitution Hall.

INTERIOR SECRETARY MANUEL LUJAN ANNOUNCES TAKE PRIDE IN AMERICA NATIONAL AWARD WINNERS

WASHINGTON, D.C.—Secretary of the Interior Manuel Lujan today announced that there are 100 National Winners in the sixth annual Take Pride in

America awards program. "The competition this year was intense," said Lujan. "These winners represent the best of America -- where citizens take responsibility and take action."

Nearly 850 nominations were received for this year's awards program and 276 were chosen as Finalists. The Winners were selected by a Blue Ribbon Panel of Judges headed by Secretary Lujan. National Winners represent 35 states, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico.

The National Winners and other awards program participants will be invited to Washington, D.C. for a July 21 ceremony at Constitution Hall, where the National Winners will be honored.

Take Pride in America, a broad-based partnership of millions of volunteers, all 50 states, 14 federal agencies, and the private sector, educates and motivates Americans to preserve and enhance the Nation's natural, cultural and historic public resources.

The Take Pride in America National Awards Program recognizes individuals and public and private organizations which have contributed to the wise use of America's resources. Individuals and groups competed in 10 categories including: Constituent Organizations/Civic Associations, Businesses/Corporations, Youth, Media, Educational Institutions, Individuals, Public/Private Partnerships, and Local, State and Federal Governments.
