WILLIAMSON NATIVE OPENS CONGRESSIONAL ART EXHIBITION

WASHINGTON DC -- Tamera Duba, of Williamson, West Virginia, joined U.S. Rep. Nick J. Rahall, Members of the Leadership of the U.S. House of Representatives and actor, Tom Cruise, in celebrating the grand opening of AN ARTISTIC DISCOVERY, the eleventh annual high school art exhibition.

Tamera Duba, a Junior of Williamson High School, was the high school art competition winner in Rep. Rahall's Congressional District for her colored pencil drawing, "Shoes in the Sand." Tamera and her parents, Earl and Debra, drove all the way from Williamson, WV to Washington, DC to join Rep.
