Dear Mr. Chairman:

It is our understanding that your Committee's Conservation, Energy, and Natural Resources Subcommittee has scheduled hearings on Wednesday and Thursday, November 5 and 6, concerning the natural gas shortage projected for this winter, the curtailments of natural gas deliveries in light of such projections, the preparedness of the federal agencies to deal with and alleviate such shortages and curtailments, and what those agencies, industries and consumers should do about them.

Rule X(1) of the Rules of the House of Representatives vests in our Committee jurisdiction over "(1) interstate and foreign commerce generally" and "(3) ...petroleum and natural gas...." Pursuant to that jurisdiction, two Subcommittees of the House Interstate and Foreign Commerce Committee have for many months been investigating, studying, and engaging in legislative consideration of the subjects mentioned above.

The Oversight and Investigations Subcommittee (chaired by John E. Moss) began investigating those matters almost

immediately after it was organized. It held hearings on them on June 9, 13, 26, and 27, July 14 and 21, and September 4 and 5. Two reports concerning deliverability of natural gas production and declining deliverability of natural gas supplies have already been issued, and the Subcommittee's investigations on the natural gas shortage are continuing.

The Energy and Power Subcommittee (chaired by John D. Dingell) has been pursuing the legislative aspects of those subjects, including study, investigation, and analysis of over 60 bills now pending before it. It held hearings on October 24 on the Federal Power Commission's failure to enforce legal requirements, which, had they been enforced, would have substantially or entirely eliminated the threat of the natural gas shortage emergency this coming winter.

The House Administration Committee's regulations, which govern the expenditure of funds for investigation, studies, oversight, and other functions of all standing committees of the House, provides in Rule 2.A.6. as follows:

"(6) No part of the funds authorized for studies and investigations to be conducted by any standing or select committee of the House shall be available for expenditures in connection with the study or investigation of any subject which is being investigated for the same purpose by any other committee of the House. The chairman of any committee contemplating such study or investigation shall furnish the Committee on House Administration information with respect to the study or investigation intended to be financed from that committee's investigating funds."

We believe that the current studies and the November 5 and 6 hearings scheduled by the Conservation, Energy, and Natural Resources Subcommittee are inconsistent with the letter and spirit of that regulation.

We respectfully submit that the subject matter of those studies and hearings is fully comprehended within the studies and investigations which our two Subcommittees have been pursuing for many months, and accordingly that these matters should be left to our two Subcommittees.
