Dear Sir:

I am pleased that the House Committee on Interstate and Foreign Commerce chose to include wording in HR 11450 to reflect their concern that families engaged in an essential household move be given some priority in securing fuel.

Household moving is a purposeful, non-recreational activity. Most all one-way household moves are essential because of employment problems; military induction, transfer or discharge; health problems; schooling; retirement; involuntary housing change; or similiar compellling reasons. More than 27,000 families in your District will be faced with this problem next year, and 13,000 will move with do-it-yourself equipment.

I would respectfully ask your help and assistance in supporting this section during the consideration of HR 11450 on the House Floor and in the final vote.
