## MEMORANDUM WITH RESPECT TO MODIFICATION CENTERS TRIP:

The airplane modification centers trip as presently arranged is as follows:

Senator Ferguson will arrive in Washington Tuesday, August 3
for a private hearing on paper pulp. Senator Hilgore will arrive
in Washington early Wednesday morning, August 4. Senator Hatch will
be in Washington at that time but doubts whether he can make the trip.

Senators Eilgore and Ferguson, General Lowe and myself and Senator Hatch if he can make it, will leave Mashington by plane early Wednesday afternoon, August 4 and will go to Birmingham where the party will stay at the Tutwiler Hotel.

Mr. Donald Lathrom will have preceded the subcommittee to
Birmingham and will report to the subcommittee with respect to the
modification center there.

On Thursday, August 5 the subcommittee will visit the modification center at Birmingham, Alabama operated by Bechtol, McCone, Parsons Corporation. B-24's are modified there and it is the largest modification center in the country. The Committee has received many complaints with respect to it.

Thursday afternoon the plane will proceed to Anniston, Alabama, about 100 miles away, for an inspection of the camp there. General Lowe will make arrangements for the Senators and himself to stay at the camp. Mr. Lathrom and myself will leave Birmingham on Thursday night, August 5 on train No. 99, the Pan American of the Louisville and Nashville, at 8:35 p. m. and will arrive at New Orleans at 7:45 a. m. on Friday, August 6.

Early Friday morning, August S the Senators and General Lowe
will leave anniston, Alabama by plane for New Orleans. The entire
party will stay at the Roosevelt Hotel at New Orleans. The subcommittee
will be at New Orleans the remainder of Friday, Saturday and Sunday
visiting the various Higgins plants and the Consolidated Vultee plant.

Early Monday morning, August 9, the subcommittee will leave New Orleans by plane for Ballas, Texas where it will stay at the Adolphus Hotel. Senator Trumen will join the party at Dallas.

On Menday, August 9 and Tuesday, August 10, the subcommittee will visit the Lockheed Medification Center at Dallas where P-36's and B-17's are being medified and the Consolidated Bomber Plant at Fort Worth where Ford B-24 bomber parts are being reassembled.

On August 11 the subcommittee will leave by plane for Kansas City where it will stay at the Botel President.

The subcommittee will visit the North American Modification Center at Kansas City and other Kansas City points on the 11th and 12th and will proceed to (maha for an exemination of the modification center there.

A letter requesting reservations at Cmaha has been directed to the Paxton Hotel and a letter requesting reservations at Chicago has been directed to the Morrison Hotel.

Senator Truman will make a speech at Kirksville, Missouri on
August 13 and will therefore not go to Omaha. He will proceed to Chicago
where he expects to make a speech on Sunday, August 15.

The plane will proceed from Omaha on August 13 to Chicago, where the party can make an inspection of the Chrysler Plant for the production of 2-3350 parts for engines.

Senator Truman has planned to fly from Chicago to Salt Lake City Sunday afternoon, August 15. However, there is no commercial plane scheduled then and arrangements are being sought to be made to obtain accommodations for him on the Streamliner City of Los Angeles, Union Pacific, leaving Chicago at 6:15 p. m. August 15 and arriving Salt Lake City 7:20 p. m. August 16. He will be registered at the Utah Rotel. If these arrangements can be consummated, the plane will probably leave Chicago on Sunday, August 15 for Washington, and if they cannot it is possible that arrangements may be made for the plane to fly Senator Truman to Salt Lake.

Arrangements beyond Salt Lake for Senator Truman and myself have not yet been completed. I expect to precede Senator Truman to Salt Lake to investigate the big steel project at Provo, Utah by going by rail from Wansas City to Salt Lake.
