WHEREAS, Sentiment has unquestionably changed and grown in favor of Woman Suffrage since the State vote of 1916; and

WHEREAS, The women of West Virginia are in no way inferior in intelligence, efficiency, patriotism and loyalty to the women of the voting states and allied countries; and

WHEREAS, Woman Suffrage has become a National Issue, and the only solution for this pressing question, now recommended by the President of the United States and other leading thinkers of the Country, is the passage of the Federal Amendment; and

WHEREAS, No one thing connected with this war is of more importance at this time, than meeting the demand of millions of loyal, patriotic women of the Nation, to submit to the states the amendment for Woman Suffrage; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Members of the Ohio County Equal Suffrage League, at their regular meeting, June 24th, 1918, impress upon the Senate the importance of immediate favorable action on the Federal Suffrage Amendment, and earnestly urge Senator Howard Sutherland to use his utmost endeavor to that end, as an act of simple justice to the women of the Nation, and in keeping with the Democratic principals of our Government; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this resolution be read into the Congressional Record.
